Scrabble Fundraiser Sweetens the GED Fund

With visions of a Q_{10} , Z_{10} , or even an X_8 on a double-double word floating in the air, lexical enthusiasts swarmed the Gotham Tavern on N. Interstate Avenue, Saturday, October 16 to play Scrabble[®]. Presented by Tuesday Scrabble[®] players and sponsored by Portland Literacy, the all-volunteer event sweetened PLC's GED fund by about \$600.

Tournament players came for fun and to help hard-working adults earn GEDs. Adult learners often are off the radar for many people, and players know how low literacy impacts lives. "I can read," said Thelma Butler. "Our ability or inability to read affects every area of our lives. I am thankful that my participation in PLC's Scrabble Benefit will in some small way help one person experience what I have enjoyed all my life-the ability to read."

Twelve teams played two 60-minute games and were ranked by combined scores for the two games. The tournament used standard game rules with two exceptions: players could donate \$1 to the GED fund each time they asked for a word look-up or returned a "threepeat" (one of three identical letters) from their rack, without losing their turn.

Prizes donated by local businesses and services were awarded to the three highest scoring teams, with the remaining prizes awarded by drawing names.

- Highest Score: 812 - Clabbers with Debby Pollack and Betty Friedman
- Second: 807 - Attaword! with Thelma Butler and Gilda Lewis
- Third: 791 - Biff and Bam with Barry Shatzman and Luisa Bauchrowitz

A special award was made for Best Team Name to Vowel Movement (Robin Christian and Cathy Kaufmann). And, Biff and Bam earned 99 points and a prize for “G₂L₁O₁M₃M₃E₁D₂,” by placing it on a triple word score.

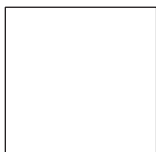
